

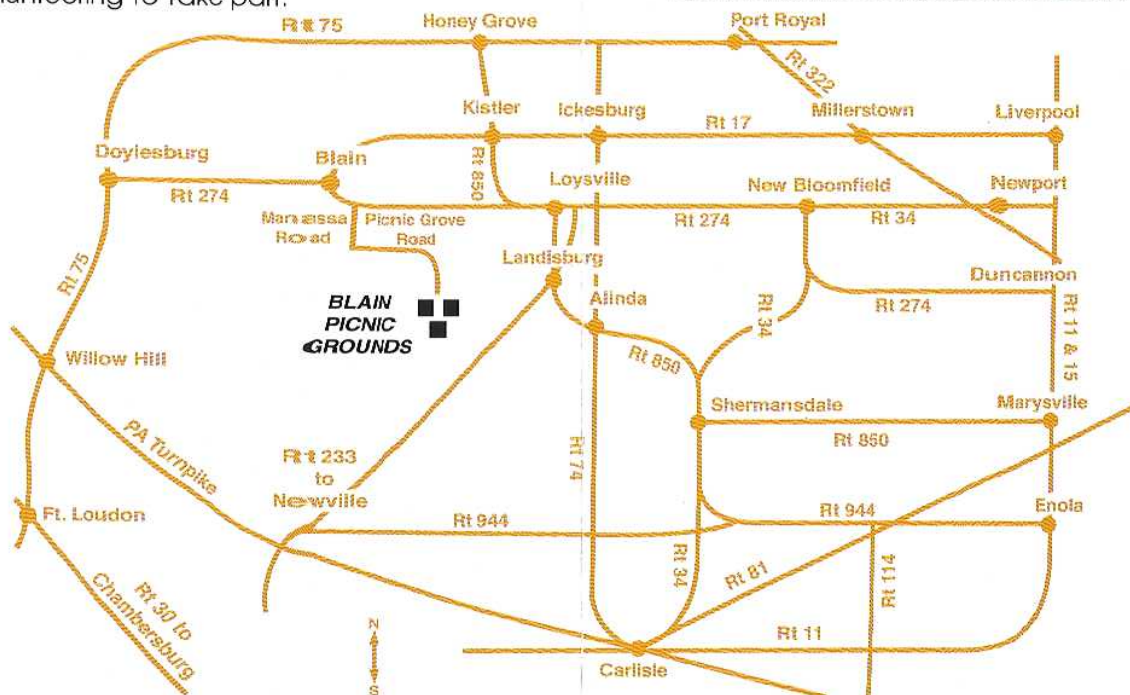


Sherman's Valley Heritage Days, Inc. is a non-profit organization which was founded in 1986. Its purpose is to demonstrate and preserve the role of antique farm equipment, vehicles, hand-craftsmanship, and the heritage of the way things were done in the "Good Old Days", and to educate the public about the importance of preserving items and practices from the past.

The Heritage Days show is organized and run by the Heritage Days association, with Heritage Days members and members of various community organizations volunteering to take part.

Anyone wishing to become a member of Sherman's Valley Heritage Days, Inc. can inquire at the Heritage Days office during the show. Meetings are held once a month throughout the year except for December.

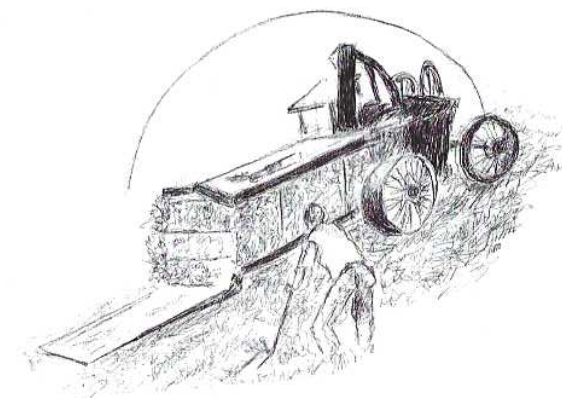
